## A New Pharmacy Display Down Under

BSHP member, **Jon Dickson** (above), has shared photos of a new history display in the School of Pharmacy, University of Newcastle, Australia. With the aim to engage current students in the profession's history, he and another local retired pharmacist have created an eye-catching mini-exhibition in just four-metres of floor space. The pharmacy school is located in Hunter Valley and is only 20 years old, but the first pharmacy in the area was recorded in 1838.

## Society of Apothecaries Adopt-a-book scheme

The Apothecaries' rare books collection of some 250 largely medical and herbal texts date from the 16th century to the mid-19th century and includes volumes in need of conservation. The ongoing scheme aims to restore these volumes for research and display use. Individuals are invited to sponsor the restoration of a book for which they will be acknowledged in a bookplate, or it is also possible to support one in memoriam. Examples of publications currently on the priority list are *The Gardener's Kalender* by Philip Miller, 1732; *Pharmacopoeia Bateana*, 1719; and *Epitomes Omnium Galeni*, 1548

William Withering first published on its use for dropsy in 1785. The first branded digoxin tablets were licensed by the US Food and Drug Administration in 1954.
